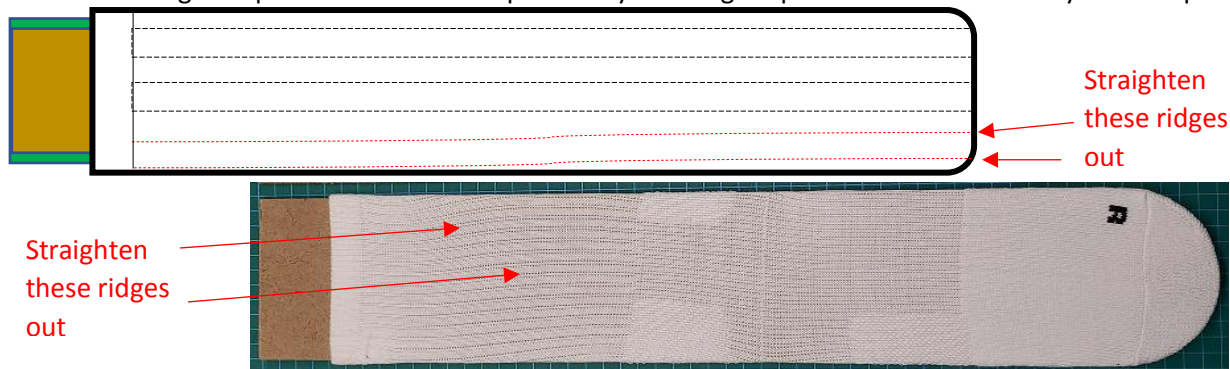


Thanks again for ordering our Sublimation Sock Jigs! We hope that they will assist you in coming up with flawless designs! Here are a few tips we wanted to pass on to you:

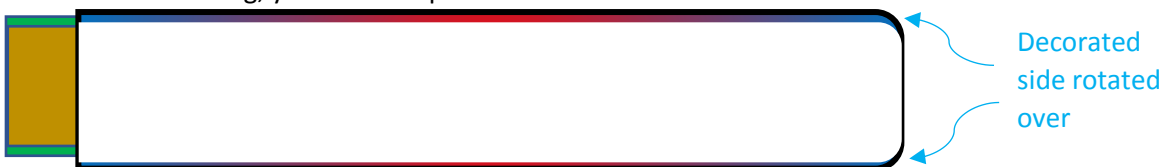
- The jigs are made from 1/8" thick hardboard, which is composed of compacted wood fibers. When these are cut, they produce a high amount of saw dust. After sanding down your jig, we blew them off with an air compressor as well as wiped them down with a damp cloth prior to shipping. We recommend wiping them down again after unpacking them with a damp cloth to ensure you get any dust that may result from shipping.
- When sublimating socks, we normally tape the rounded edge as well as both sides with heat resistant/Teflon tape. This help ensures that the socks can be slid over the jig easily without snagging. You should do this as well, see the image below:



- Use the "ridges" in the socks to make sure the sock is as straight as possible when placed on the jig. The "ridges" should run as straight as possible, parallel to the side of the jig. If there are any curves, use your fingers to work them as straight as possible. This will help ensure your image is pressed as intended on your final product.



- If pressing an "all around the sock" design, once you have the sock aligned you can press the first side by placing the print out on top of the sock. Once the first side is completed, turn the sock over to the blank side, then use your fingers to rotate the sock towards the middle of the blank side so that the edge of the jig has ink from the completed side sublimated on it. The blank side should have a slight edge of the completed side showing so that there will be a continuous design on the sock, without that white void. Make sure the ridges are straight on the blank side after rotating, you can now press the second side:
